This was the year we lost so many members of our class who still remain in our memories.

Officers chosen to lead us that year were: President, Lynda Holmes; Vice-President, Ron Isom; Secretary,Rhonda Engstedt; Treasurer, Karen Rohde; and Sponsor, Mrs. Malcolm. The cash on hand at the beginning of the year was $\$ 263,15$. The year started out busy and never let up. One of the first things we did was to elect an Assistant Editor, Anne Carpenter, and an Assistant Business Manager, Ron Isom, for the annual. Then we undertook our project of selling Christmas cards. This wasn't one of the most pleasaht things we did as it was alot of work but proved to be very profitable. Our first semester class party was held in the restaurant. It was really a lot of fun. We danced, played games, and of course ATE. Our next big undertaking was our Junior class play. Mrs. Hughes, our director, chose the play "There goes the bride". It was a comedy in three acts, and although at times it was discouraging, it went off a big success. It was a rewarding experience to all those who participated, and one we shall never forget as a wonderful part of our high school days. Soon after the play was given we were to lose two members of our class, Dean Chase and Merlyn Luhr. We decided that we's give them a surprise farewell party and so we had a sock hop in the gym. Now our greatest task of the year was getting underway, the Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom. After much debating "Rendezuous of the Stars" was chosen as our theme. On May 12, 1961, members of both the Junior Senior classes assembled at the entrance to the gym which was finally ready for the big event after hours and hours of planning, decorating, and hard work. As we entered, a bright array of Royal Purple and Lavender crepe paper and glittering stars met our eyes as we were transplanted in the heavenly wonderland. After a delicious meal and an entertaining program we had the prom. It was a wonderful way to end our Junior year.

We began our last year here at Allen with the election of our officers, they were: President, Dean Chase; Vice-President, Loyal Steube; Secretary, Anne Carpenter; Treasurer, Karen Rohde; and Sponsor, Mr. Mitchell. Our opening balance was $\$ 339.47$. The first projects our senior year were to have our senior pictures taken at Genelli's Studios and to select our annual staff. In September was Homecoming, the ceremonies were held in the gym in the afternoon and that evening the royalty toured the field in a white convertible at half time. Later a dance was held in the gym. Our first semester class, party was an invitational dance for the whole high school. As the year progressed we began turning our thoughts toward graduation and the preparations for it. We selected our class flower, a rose, class colors, white and rose pink, and our motto, "Out of school's life, into life's school." Our next steps toward graduation were the selection of announcements and the choosing of a place to go for sneak day. We finally decided to go to Chicago. We left May 4 and reached Chicago the next morning. We visited various places of interest and really had a lot of $f \mathrm{un}$. Our Senior class play entitled "Three Blind Dates" was given May 8 and 9 and was a big success thanks to the direction of Mr. Mook. That weekend was the Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom. It was a beautiful evening and everyone enjoyed it very much. May 13 was Baccalaureate services held at the Methodist Church. Then on May 18, 1962, our 4 wonderful years of high school came to end as adorned in cap and gown we received our diplomas at the graduation ceremonies. It was a wonderful 4 years for all of us and with saddened hearts we left dear old Allen behind to face the future.
