Our Junior year was the busiest of all our years in high school. This, of course, was our JuniorSenior Banquet and Prom. We chose the theme "Hawaiian Cruise" and the gym was decorated in dark blue and aqua. After much planning, hard work, (and fun!), our exciting event took place on May 11, 1962. Everyone agreed that it was a very successful event and a nice way to end our Junior year.

We began our final year at Allen High with the election of officers. They were: President, Roger Roberts; Vice President, Rex Wheeler; Secretary, Carol Stenwall; Treasurer, Robert Noe; and Sponsor, Mr. Mitchell. Our opening balance was $\$ 334$. New members entering our class were Virginia Smith and Jerry Barelman. For our first semester class party, we went to the Normandy for supper and to a show afterwards. As the year progressed, our thoughts turned toward graduation. Everyone had the ir Senior pictures taken. We selected our class flower, Crimson Rose; class, colors; aqua blue and silver; and the class motto, "We have crossed the sea, the ocean lies before us." We also selected our graduation announcements and chose a place to go for Senior Sneak Day. Our Senior class play, "Apple Blossom Time" was presented on March 29 and 30 under the direction of Mr. Mook. It was very successful and the cast enjoyed putting it on.

Our four years of high school ended with the traditional Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom on May 3 and the Graduation ceremonies on May 22. It was a wonderful four years for all of us, years which we will never forget. We now leave dear old Allen High and face the world that lies before us.
