We began as freshmen in 1960. We elected officers as follows: President, Dwight Gotch; Vice President, Richard Osbahr; Secretary, Sandra McCaw; and Treasurer, Dean Lisle. At this time there were sixteen members in the class and Mr. Mozer was acting as sponsor. Foi recreation we had a supper party which was combined with the sophomore class.

As we started our sophomore year we were minus a few of our regular freshmen members. Dianna Biggerstaff was married, Charles Self and Ellen Sherman had moved away, and Bill Ellis dropped school and began work on a farm, however, our membership received an increase of one when Edward Van Cleave of Waterbury began his school attendance here. This left us with a total of thirteen members. We began our final year of school at Allen High with Mr. Mitchell as our class sponsor and electing for officers David Hickman as President, Richard Osbahr as Vice President, Irma Osbahr as Secretary and John Brawner as Treasurer. On September 16 we had a chicken supper with a profit of $\$ 72.00$ which seems to have disappeared in the expanse of time since then. Just after the end of the first semester Sandra McCaw was married to Richard Heaton March 1, 1964 at the Springbank Friends Church and thereby decreasing our graduating class to the number of nine once more. In the process of beginning to prepare for graduation the class chose a white carnation for the ir flower, pink and white as class colors and motto, "'The Harvest of Success Is From the Seed of Desire."

On the whole we consider our four years of high school a very exciting time full of rich experiences in thought which will help us through the rest of our lives.
