It is appropriate that ! should comment about our two guests, Maridia Fernandes and Ricardo Gardenal, who have been with us since shortly before Christmas.

Last September International Fellowship, Inc., of Buffalo, New York, wrote me a letter to inquire if we would be willing to host a South American student for a three-month period. This letter was followed by a few phone calls to us to inquire further. I was to be the local coordinator. I asked students their opinion and also questioned several adults regarding the possibility of a foreign exchange student visiting Allen. Nearly everyone responded positively, so I felt safe to proceed carefully to seek suitable hosts for one.

Two suitable families responded, and I felt both were well qualified, so I reported this. International Fellowship agreed to send two, and the host families were contacted by them. From that point the Host families, International Fellowship, and the students car-
ried on. The cost of the program was shared. The students paid the $\$ 600$ plus (cost of transportation and insurance). The host families had to agree to furnish food, housing, transportation for school and worship plus clothes washing. In return, the host family was to act as parents and expect students to work as their own children and be able to deduct $\$ 50$ per month for income tax purposes.

The students have shown a great interest in the people and activities of the community and expressed satisfaction in the way people have received them.

Schools south of the equator have been having summer vacation during this time so Maridia and Ricardo have not missed school. Classes resume for them in March, so they will both go back to finish high school next term. Both students plan to become doctors.

Both students went on a tour to Washington, D. C. and New York the week of February 22-28. Paula Reuter, host sister of Maridia, also went on the tour. After the tour Maridia returned to her home at Sao Paulo, Brazil. Paula Reuter and Ricardo returned, and Ricardo left Allen for his home at Canada De Gomez, Argentina, the following week.
