... we thought graduation seemed so far away and would never come.





COMMUNICATIVE SKILLS AND ART

Each student is given Reading Tests, so his weaknesses can be determined. These tests check for speed and accuracy, vocabulary, and comprehension of reading.

Through daily observation and contact with each student, the information gathered can be grouped under these headings — reading performance, reading potential, and correlates and causes.

Mrs. Roberts meets with each student, or groups of students, one-half hour each day.

The Communicative Skills class was structured around the four basic means of communication — reading, writing, listening and speaking. Exercises in these areas were made relative to the individual. An unstructured classroom environment allowed for freedom of expression and independent study in a particular area.

This was followed by other two-dimensional experiences in collage, monochromatic painting, and linoleum block printing. Individual work was done in sculpture weaving, decoupage, copper enameling, macrame and ceramics. Through direct experience working in Art, one gains a greater appreciation of artists and their work.
