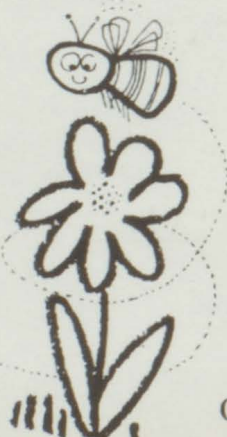
## *fall's main event is homecoming*

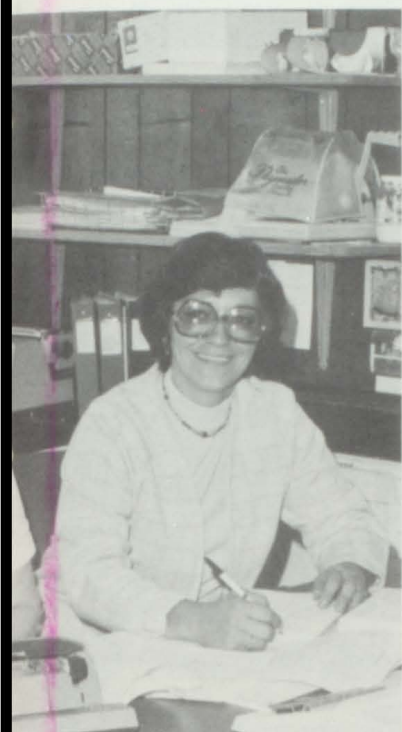
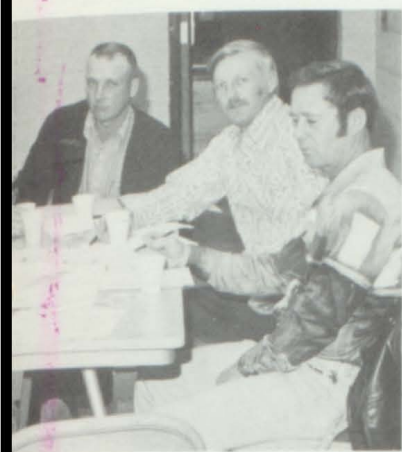


## *school staff sets the pace*
