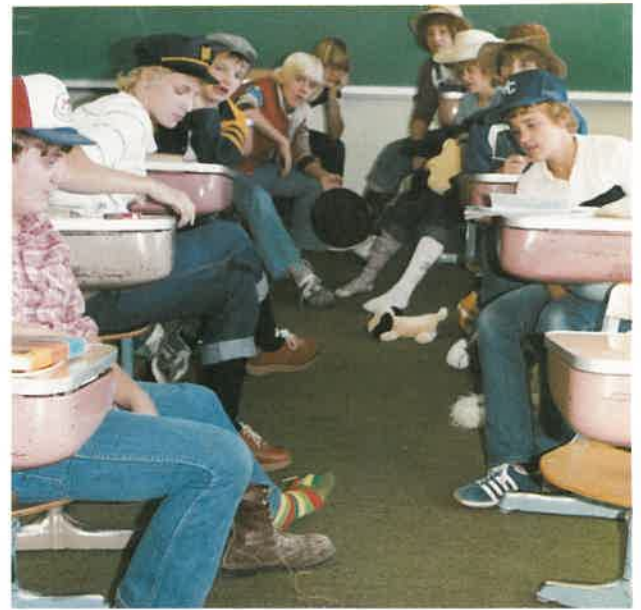

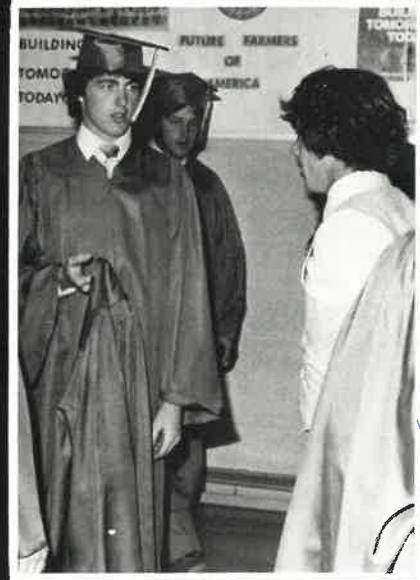
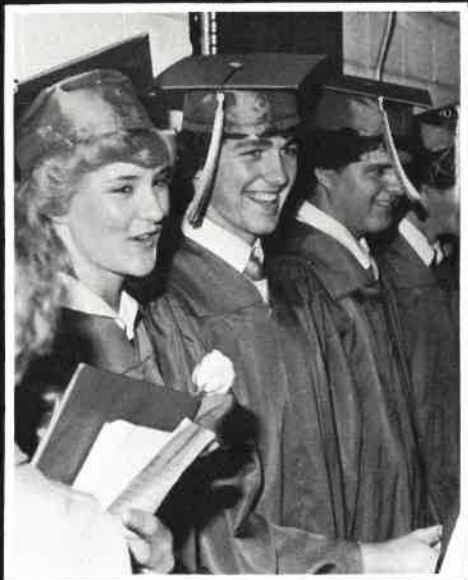


The senior class looked forward to their sunrise and their own bright new future.
