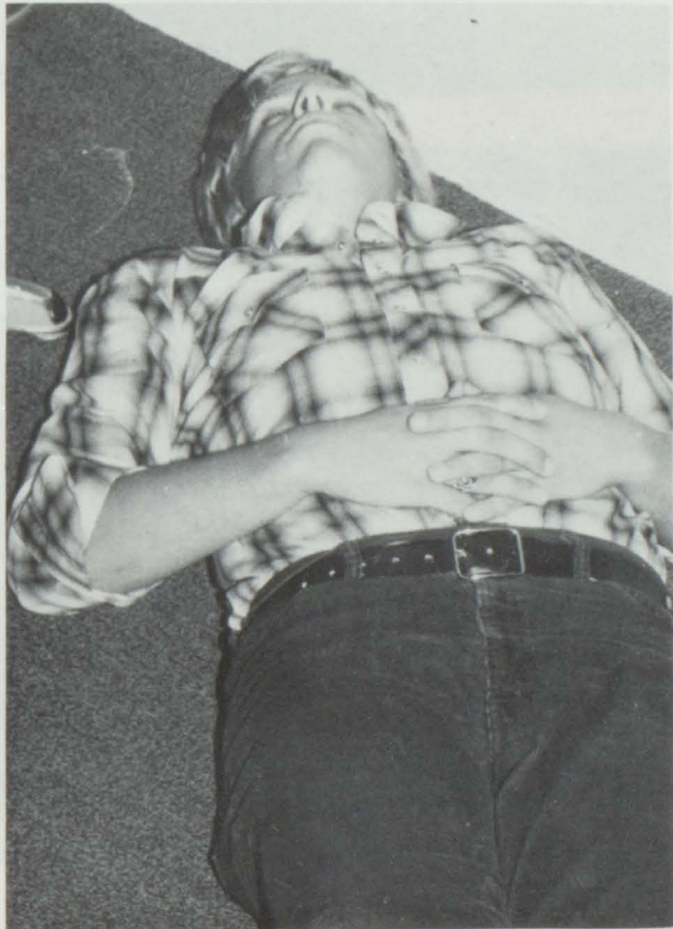


Juniors' "program" includes County Government Day and Junior-Senior Banquet.

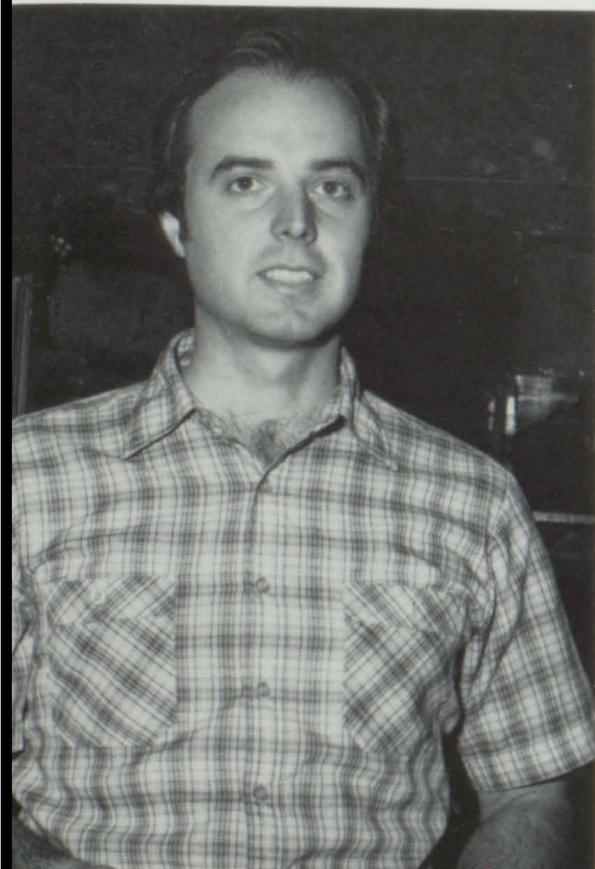

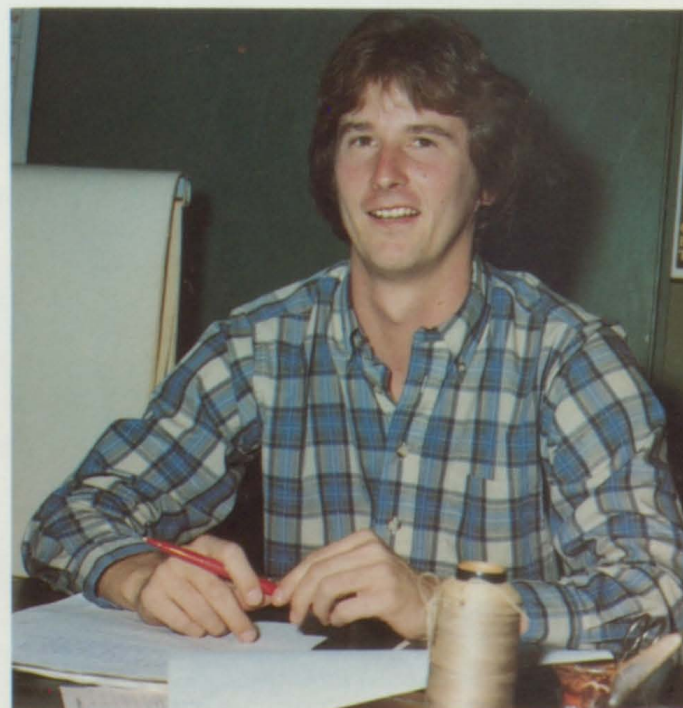
