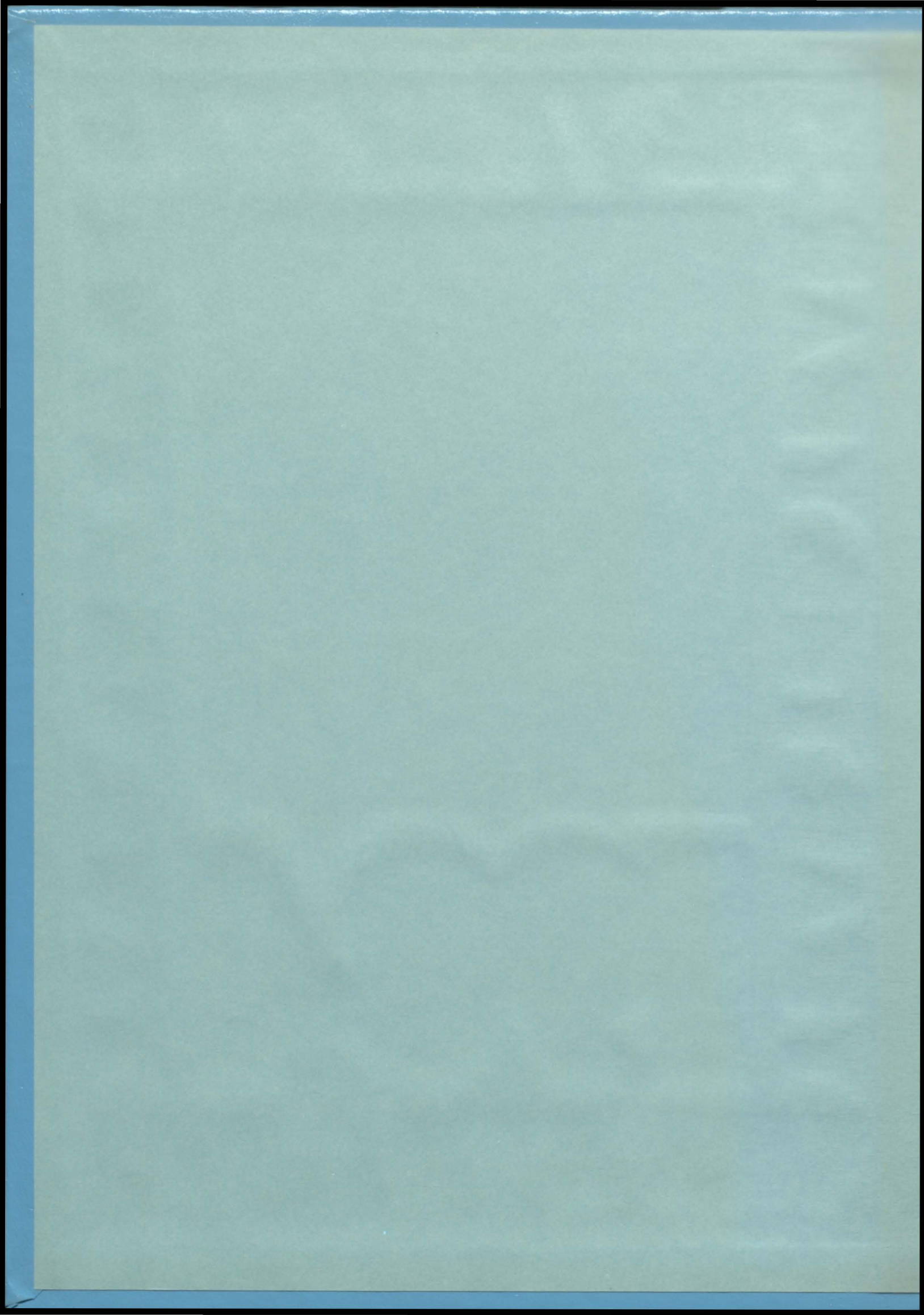

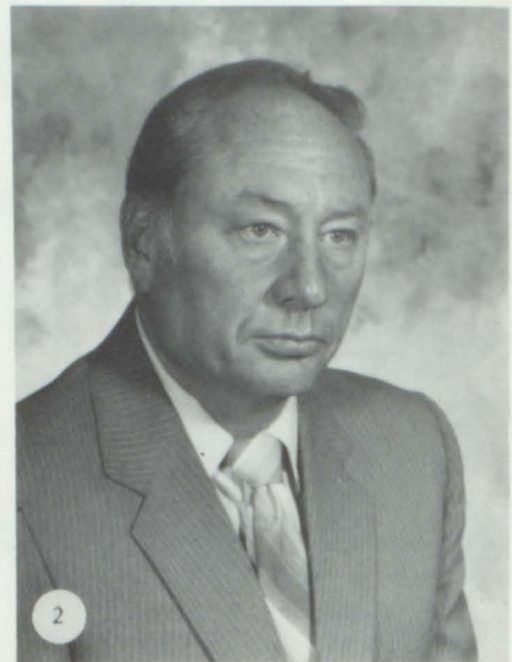

1 MR. DAVID BELT directed the entire instrumental and 7-12 vocal program this year at Allen Consolidated School.

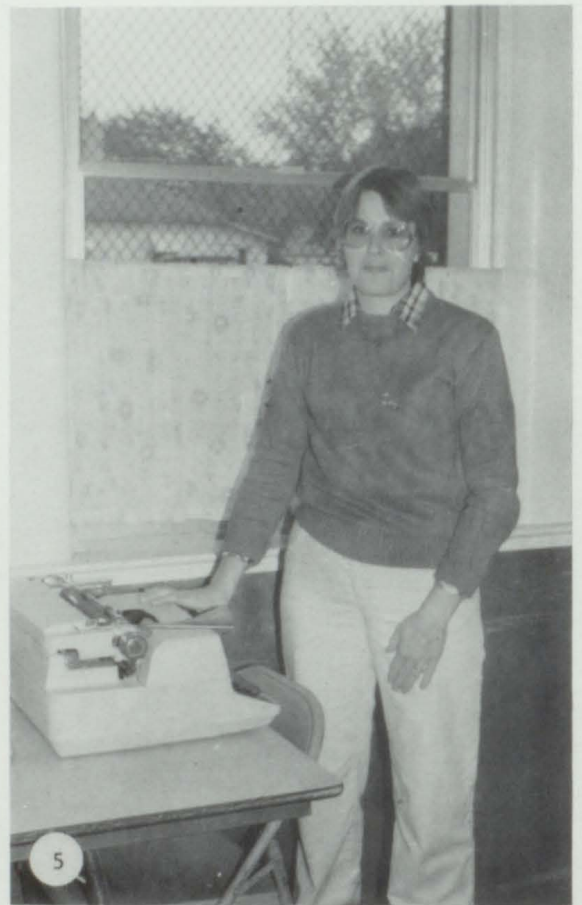

1 Our Monday, Wednesday, and Friday part-time elementary music instructor this year was MRS. SHARON EVANS.

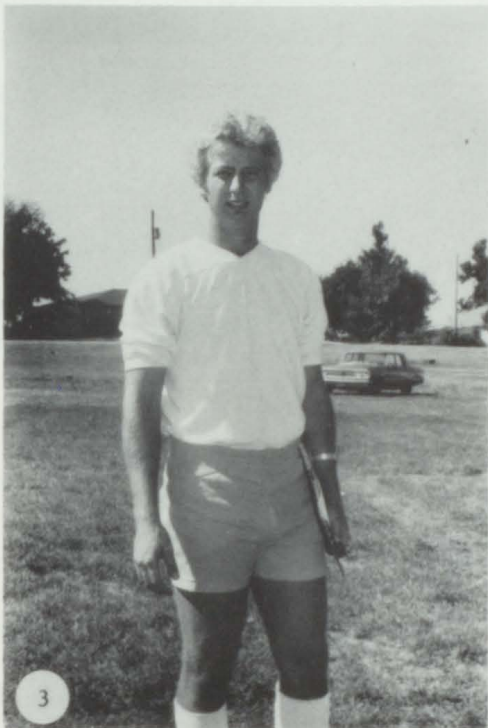

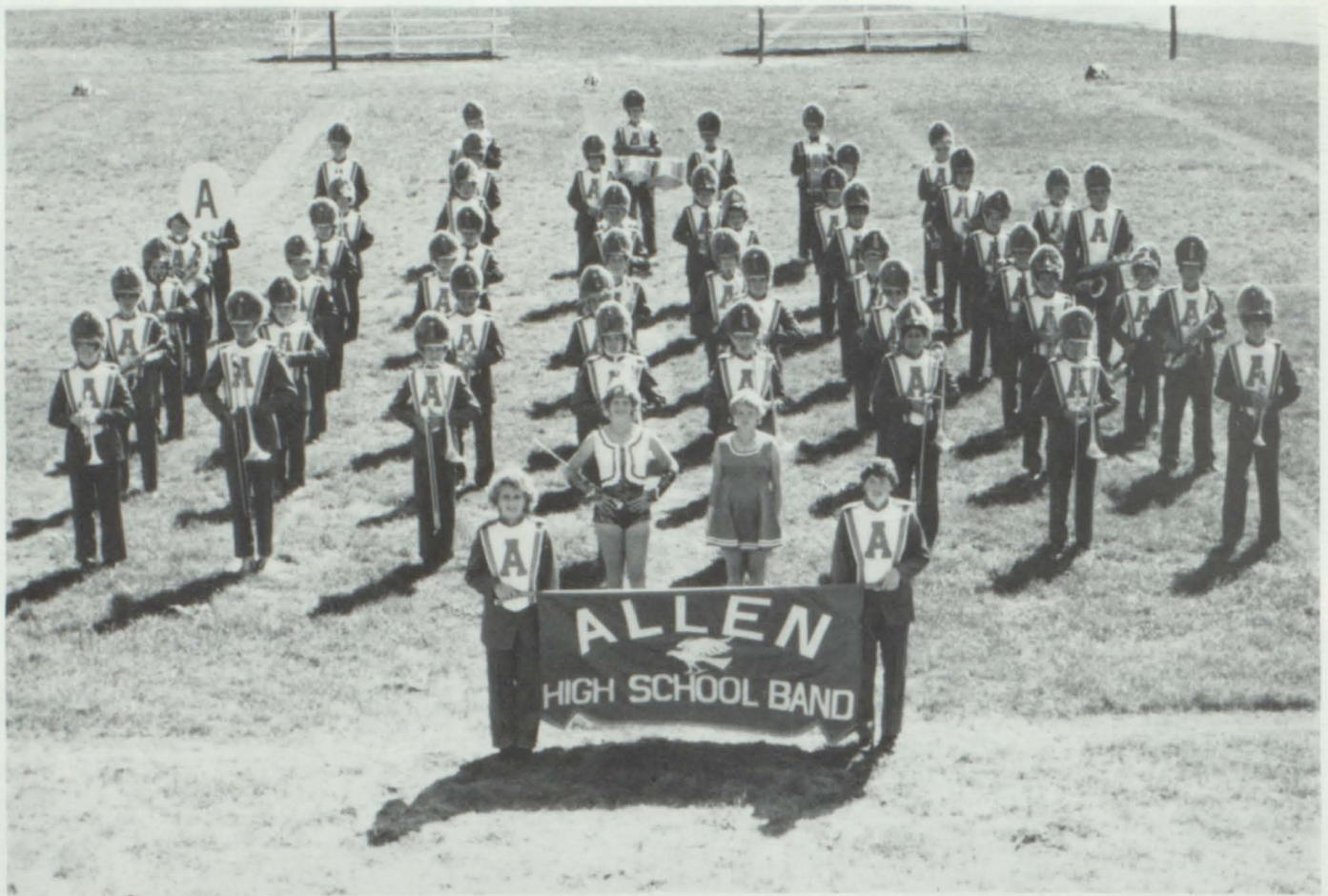




## Scenes From The Christmas And Pops Concerts Include A Majority Of Students.

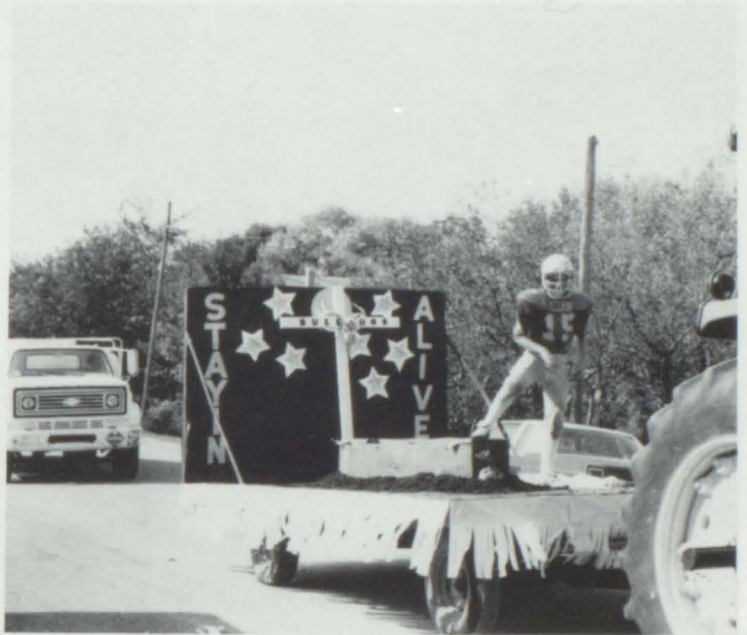

## Track activities competed with the weather during spring, 1984.

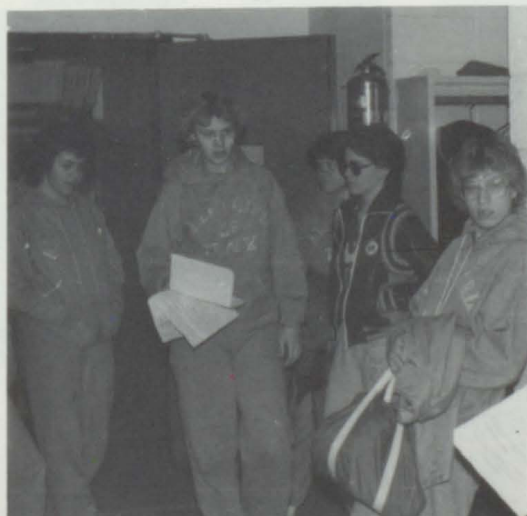
