In Allen, school opened on Monday, August 26, 1985, for a full day of classes from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with busses running.

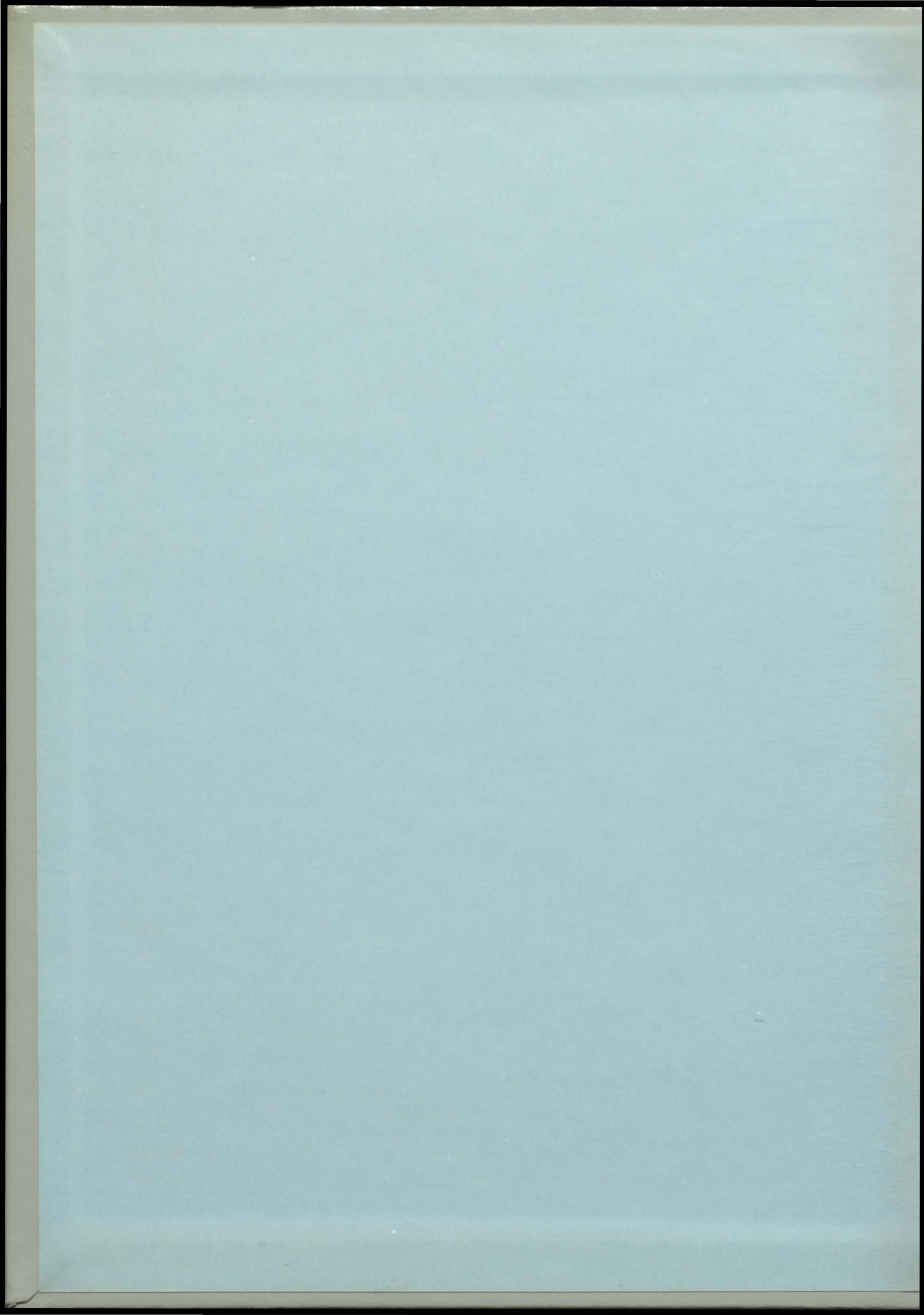
The sports season at Allen will kick off with the girls playing in the Pender volleyball tournament on September 5 and 7.

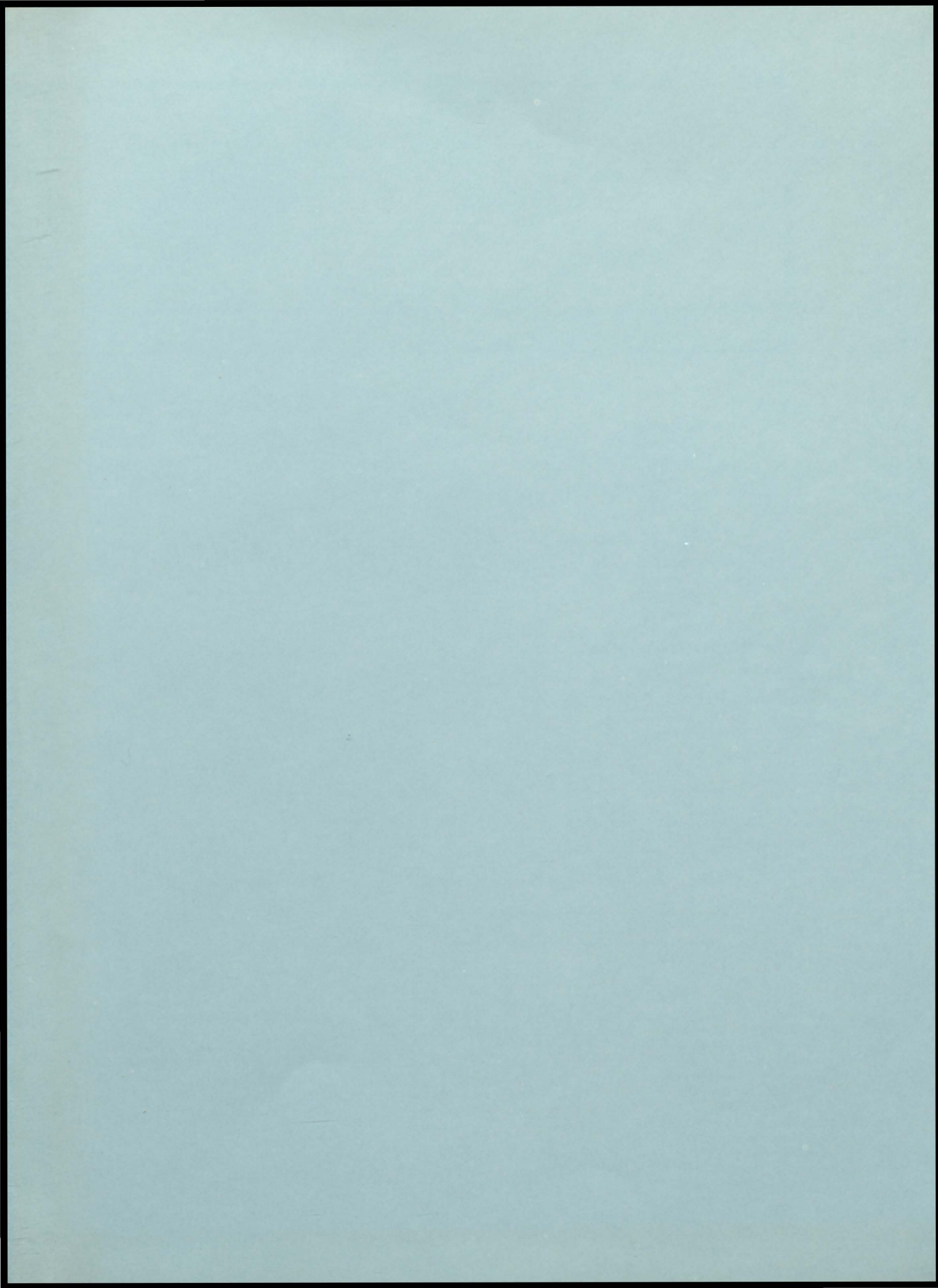
The boys begin their football season at Wynot on September 6.

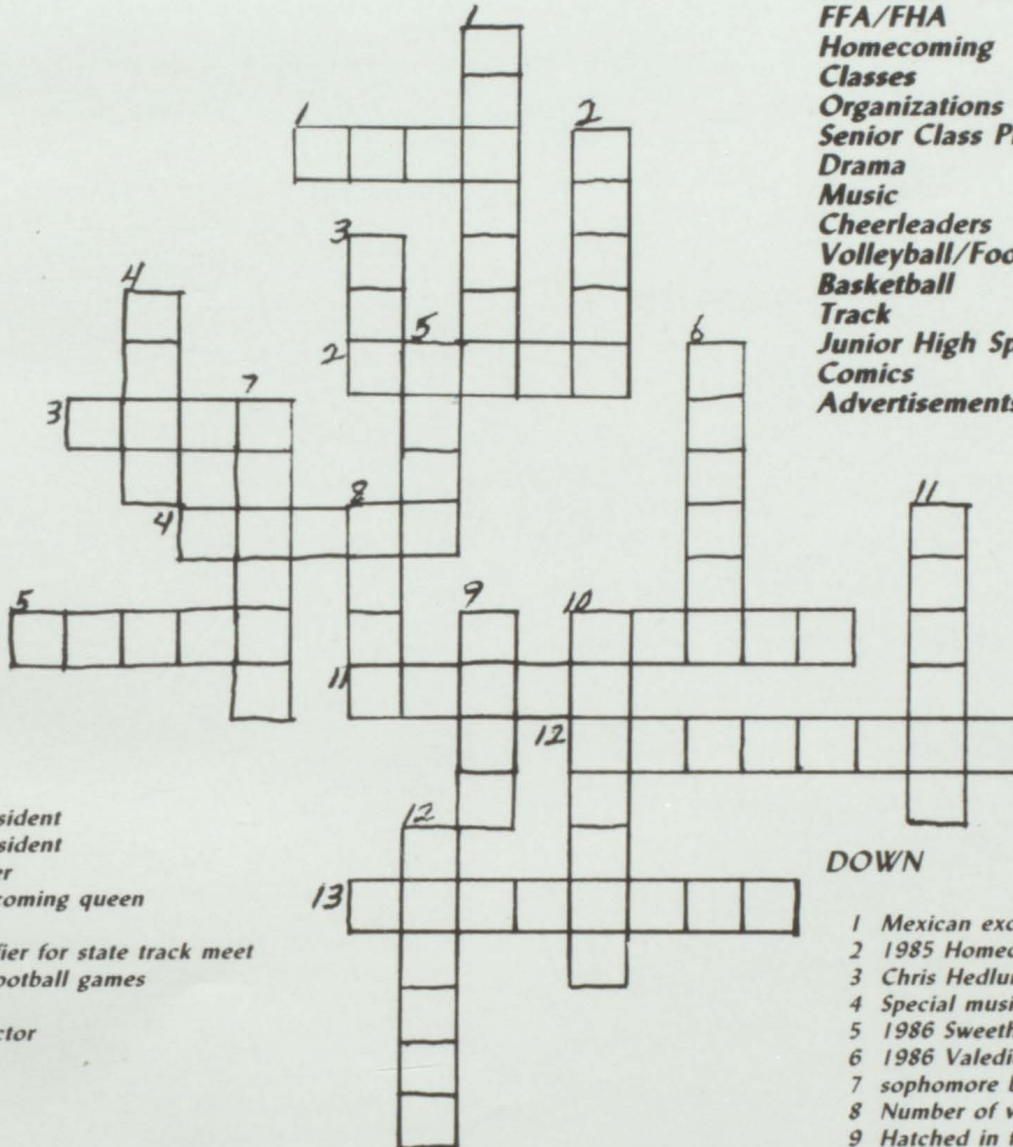

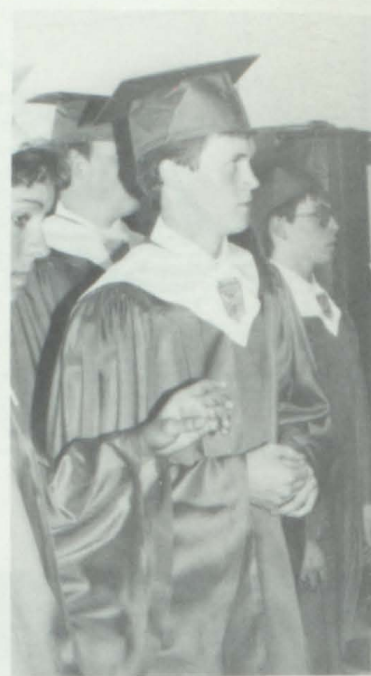
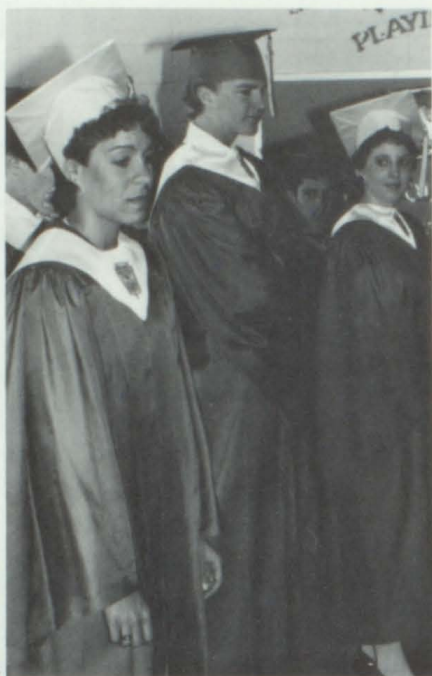

# Allen To Graduate 20 Sunday Afternoon

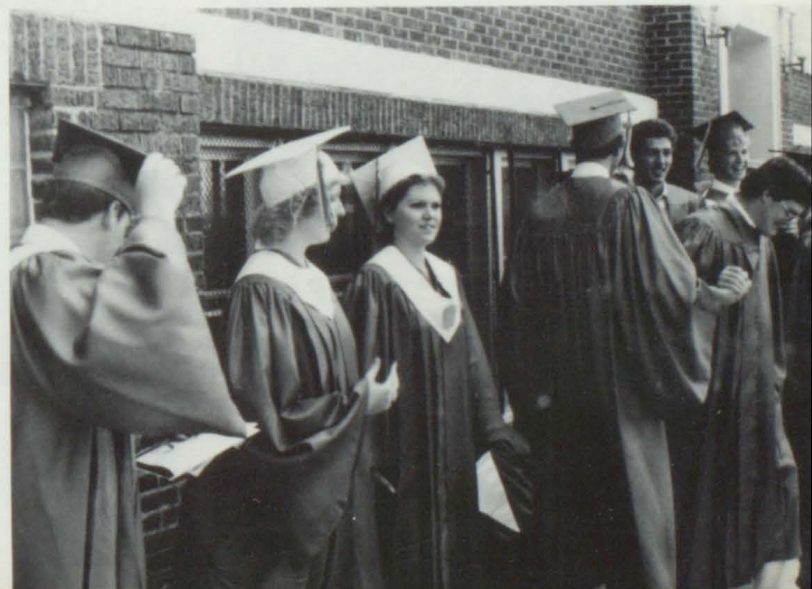
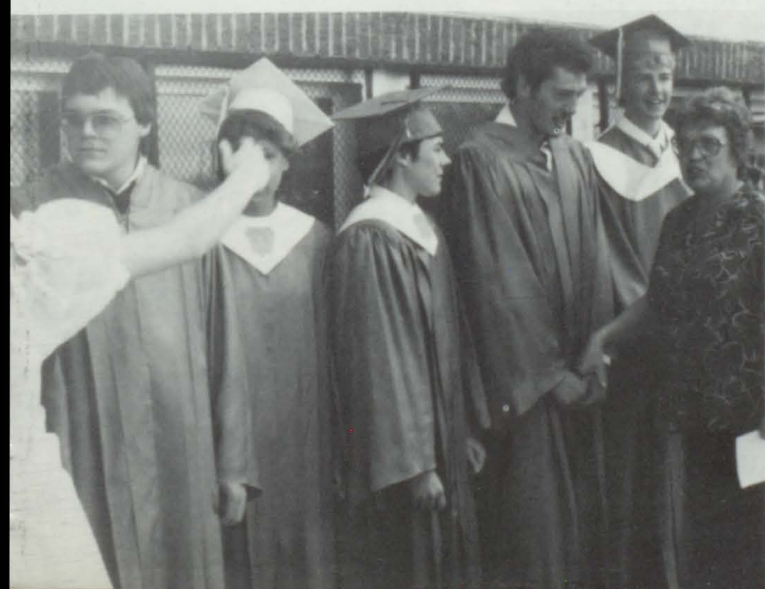

The valedictorian and salutatorian will give addresses.

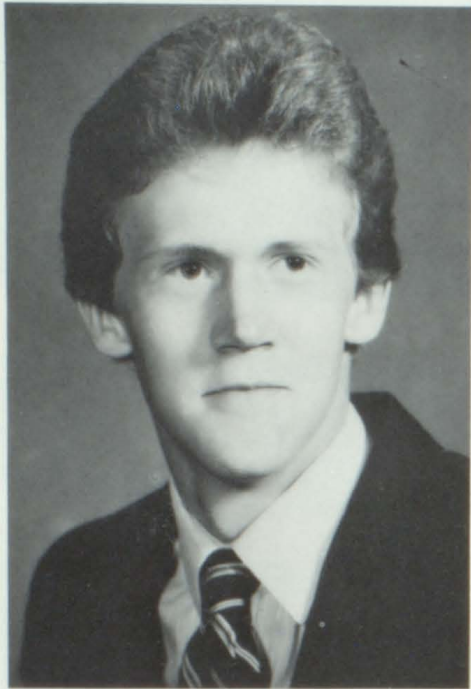

## The FFA and FHA have programs for both education and entertainment.

The FHA chapter tried to make itself a more visible group by decorating a bulletin board in the main hall each month and publishing a monthly newsletter, "Eye Opener", prior to the meeting date. They collected money for the American Diabetes Association and had a pizza supper as their own money making project this year. Again the group had secret sisters, remembered with birthday gifts, Christmas gifts, and friendly notes. They celebrated Christmas by having a cookie exchange and by watching Red Dawn. The group hosted district convention in the fall and, despite a surprise snowstorm, five girls attended State Leadership Conference in the spring. Jointly working with the FFA, the FHA sponsored a hayrack ride, ice skating party, the Sweetheart coronation and dance, and served the meal at the FFA consignment auction. The last major project of the year was the Salad Buffet supper where prospective eighth grade members and their mothers were invited to enjoy the meal and learn about

the organization. Several FFA projects promoted agriculture. Among these endeavors were pheasant raising by several members, local, district, and state tractor driving contests, livestock judging contests, and agricultural skills, such as welding contests. Community improvement projects included making new signs for each end of town and building and installing gates for the Dixon County fairgrounds. A consignment sale and slave auction was held in the fall and the annual fruit and cheese sale was held in early winter as the fund-raising project for the chapter. The group had several educational programs this year. It went to Port Neal Power Plant for a field trip and had a state patrolman as a guest speaker at the October meeting.
