The two smiling daisies that Friend Bear proudly wears reflect the warmth that Friend Bear generates and helps us to remember that it takes two to make a friendship.



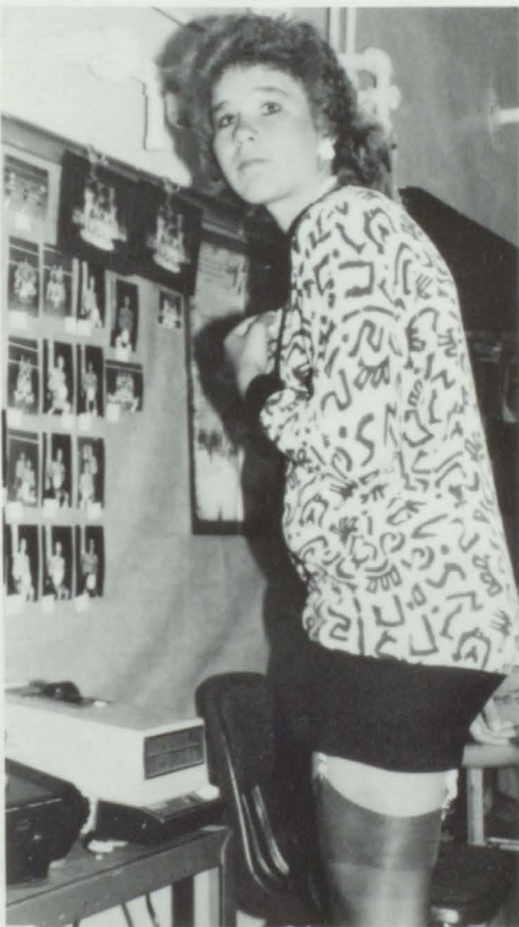

### Love-a-Lot Bear <sup>TM</sup>

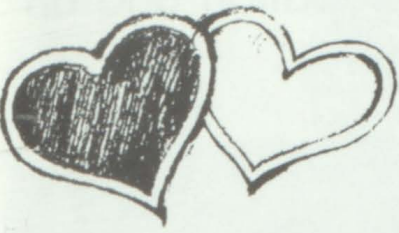
