


Annual staff coordinated the yearbook theme and the town's Centennial.

As the Annual Staff (see page 1) met at the beginning of the school year to plan this book and decide upon a theme, the town's Centennial and the importance of the school to the town were discussed. As the staff researched the history of the school, it found that already in the spring of 1890 a concerned group of men had met to organize the public school to be located in the newly-platted village. The district would be numbered 70, and plans were made for construction of a frame schoolhouse. The first class graduated in 1895. After much questioning, it was decided that the eagle evolved into the school's mascot sometime during the 1920's. The staff decided to use an eagle theme and unanimously approved of Stacy Carlson's idea of "100% Pure Eagle." Shown on this page are some of the varied styles of eagles used in yearbooks throughout the years.

In addition to producing the yearbook, the staff was involved in other Centennial activities. It planned and presented the homecoming program of past royalty introductions. The staff also used past annuals to find school "trivia" for use by the Alumni Association and Centennial Committee during Alumni Day, July 5, 1991. As a continuation of last year's project of working on the Centennial History Book, the staff helped with the mailing and distribution of the Allen

History Books and returning of the pictures used in the book.




The student body was represented by the student council.


Sweetheart Dance is well attended.
