## ALLEN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS

Allen, Nebraska 1994-95

School District \#70 was formed in the new town of Allen as a 1-8 school in the spring of 1890 .
Construction of a wooden two-story structure was begun on the site of the present school building and was ready for occupation in May, 1893. Because of the increase in enrollment and the addition of the four high school grades, it became necessary to build the present brick schoolhouse in 1918. Time brought other changes in structural facilities, expanded curriculum, extra-curricular activities, and services offered to students. Fluctuations in class sizes, programs offered, and classification have occurred through the years, but the main goal for the past century of educating children has stayed the same. We are proud to mark 1995 as the 100th year of graduating classes from Allen Consolidated Schools. The picture above notes which years students did graduate. Those years blacked out denote no graduates that year
To carry out the recognition of the longevity of education at Allen, we have made note on student and staff names on pages 21-28 of generations attending or graduating from Allen. Following each student's name is the number designating what generation he/she is of his/her family to attend Allen. The key is as follows: F-father, pat Gr-paternal grandparent(s), pat Grt Gr-paternal great grandparent(s), M-mother, mat Gr-maternal grandparent(s), mat Grt Gr-maternal great grandparent(s). If information does not follow a name, the annual staff was unable to obtain the information when requested from the parents.

> One hundred years of graduating classes from AHS is the theme of the 1994-95 annual.

The Annual Staff chose the theme for the 1994-95 yearbook as "How Times Have Changed" in conjunction with the celebration of 100 years of graduating classes. As we worked on the theme, we found some things which have changed and others which have not.

Looking through past yearbooks gave us a basis to decide those things which have stayed the same. The yearbook, first published in 1936 , has always been a publication of interest and enjoyment to all. We had fun working on pages $3-8$ as we used modern technology to scan pictures from past annuals of graduating parents of students in grades $7-12$. By comparing the parents and their children, we could see the family similarities. It was also interesting to note on pages $21-28$ the number of ancestors of present students who attended or graduated from Allen. After sending a survey to parents, the staff compiled the information which follows the student and staff names. The number following each designates what number generation he/she is to attend school at Allen. The abbreviation key is as follows: F means father attended/graduated, pat Gr refers to paternal grandparent(s), pat Grt Gr refers to paternal great grandparent(s), $M$ means mother attended/graduated, mat Gr refers to maternal grandparent(s), and mat Grt Gr refers to maternal great grandparent(s). A surprising number of students are fourth generation attendees at Allen Consolidated Schools. The Annual Staff was unable to get the survey returned from those students who have no information following their name. As we looked through the past annuals, we noted some physical things which haven't changed. We still have the same FFA jackets and boys' track jerseys, the same home economics room appliances, and the same desks. Of course, the basic purpose of a school-educating the students-remains the same.

Annual staff members brainstormed and looked at annuals to note changes which have occurred in the school. Building additions were made through the years and rooms have been used for a variety of purposes. Earlier students knew the junior high rooms as the lunch room and kitchen; the lunch room was once the band room; the library was the assembly and stage; the superintendent's office was the business room; the "pi"" was once the gym, just to mention a few. The present football field, built in 1950, replaced the field behind the schoolhouse. The gym, built in 1961, necessitated moving the playground to the west side of the building. Then the construction of the metal music/ag building made it necessary to move the playground to the south of the school. Even now the wood shop is being yearly changed with the insulating and sheetrocking project. Another continuing change is the paintings on the walls. Just this year the Care Bears on the lower hallway were replaced by Disney characters. Curriculum and extra-curricular activities have changed through the years. Former students studied shorthand and typing, now its is keyboarding and computers, SERC classes and videos. Segregated physical education classes are unheard of today. Boys' athletics which once included trap shooting and baseball have always been important to the school. A major change was the inclusion of girls' athletics in 1967. The many trophies attest to the importance and quality of the athletic teams through the years. Annual staff members noted the changes in uniforms and dress styles over the years. Capes for the band, tight athletic uniforms, and to-the-ankle cheerleading skirts were once a mark of pride for the students. The letter jacket and pep club sweater were formerly necessities for each student. Now the pep club is nonexistent. The style of clothing and dress code has become more informal and lenient through the years. Homecoming, begun in 1939 with just a queen, has changed yearly. The voting techniques, the Homecoming activities (including initiation or lack of it), coronation, parade, and pep rally are always different. Senior sneak trips are a thing of the past, but the band traveled as far away at St. Louis for competition. No longer do we have class plays, but this year a musical was presented for the first time. Everyone could easily reminisce of how things used to be, but we hope that all the changes are for improvement of the school and the educational system at AHS.
