The Student Council consists of two delegates from each class and the class president from grades 7-12. Its main priority is to sponsor Homecoming and teach students leadership skills.

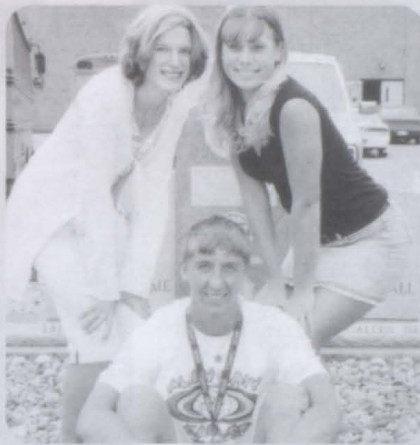

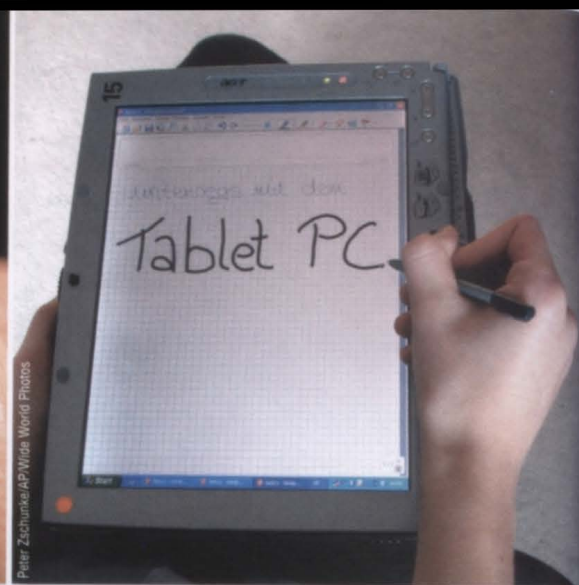

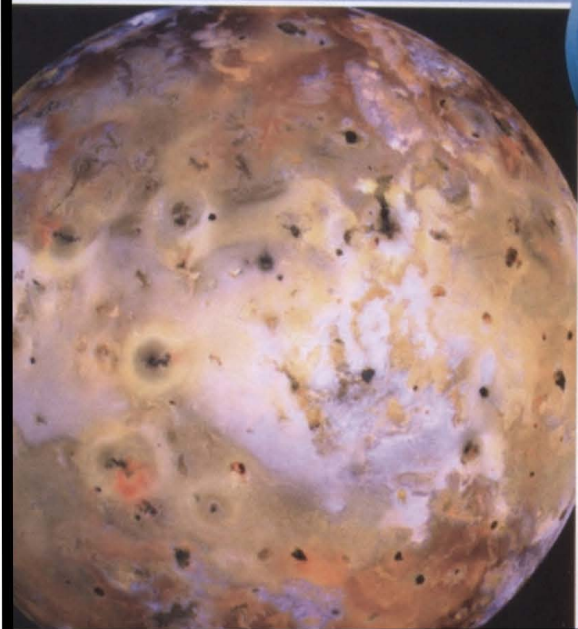

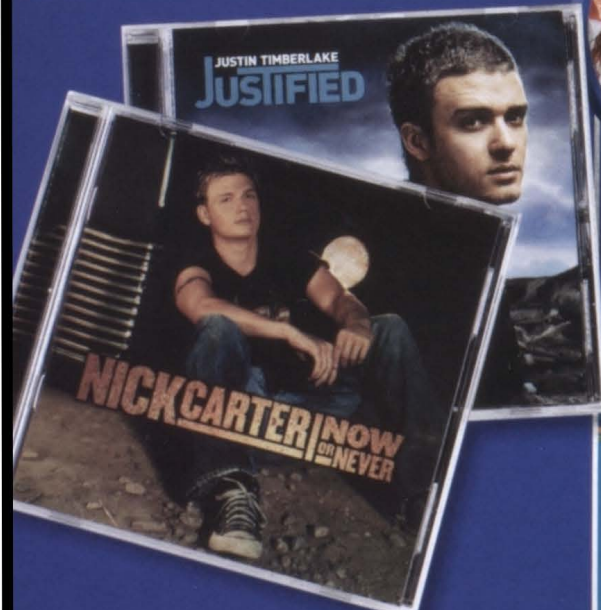

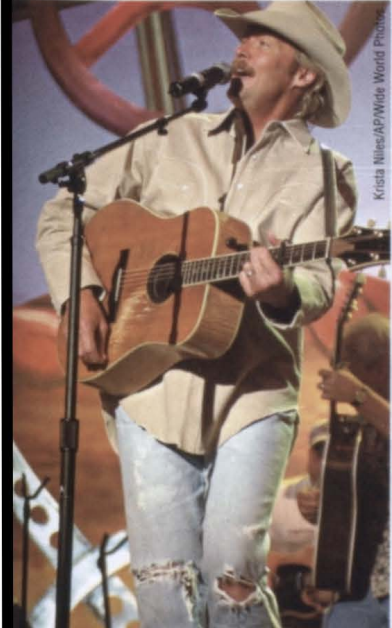

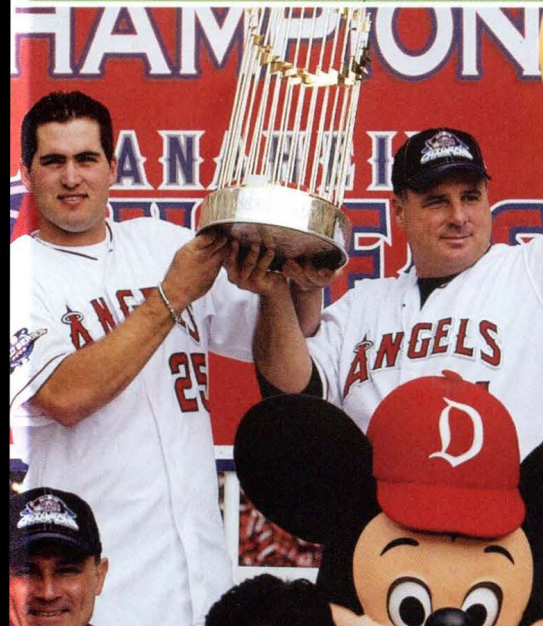
